After the Second World War the plant winds down until in 1964 it closes

Following the end of the First World War the factory closed and is sold in 1926.

Nobel's Explosives Manufacturing Co. build a factory at Pembrey to manufacture high explosives, and a separate factory for filling shells is built next to it. In 1917 both factories are nationalised.

Pembrey Country Park opens in 1980.

At the start of the Second World War construction starts on a new Government factory, this time called the Royal Ordnance Factory Pembrey.

1882 - Stowmarket explosives company begin to manufacture dynamite amongst the sand dunes of Pembrey Burrows. However it is short lived—a terrible explosion killing 7 young people ends production at the site which is then used only for warehousing and storage. This site is listed on maps at the 'old dynamite works'

After the First World War the administration buildings are used as a school camp for the children of unemployed miners of South Wales.
